

1. TRAVEL PLAN – All

motorized vehicles must be kept on designated routes. Such routes are clearly identified on the Coeur d'Alene River Ranger District Travel Plan Map. Due to vandalism and weathering of signs, they are not always marked on the ground. Please take care to know which routes have been designated for riding.

2. This map shows a designated ATV route off 4th of July that is open from Memorial Day to Labor Day.

3. There are small segments of shared use connecting trailheads. Please use caution at these sites.

OFF-HIGHWAY REQUIREMENTS

There are two requirements for ATV's and motorbikes operating off-highway on an unmaintained road, trail or area.

- Valid Motorbike/ATV Registration and Sticker. Idaho Code (IC) 67-7122.
- Muffler and spark arrestor. Your muffler has to pass 96 db at the half-meter test. IC 67-7125.

NON-RESIDENT REQUIREMENTS

Non-residents are not required to have a valid Motorbike/ATV Registration and Sticker, unless they have operated in Idaho for over 30 days. After that time, non-residents must register their ATV or motorbike.

WHERE DO I REGISTER FOR OFF-HIGHWAY USE?

- Most motorbike and ATV dealers.
- Most county motor vehicle departments.
- Idaho Dept. of Parks & Recreation offices.

UNPAVED ROADS ON FEDERAL AND STATE PUBLIC LANDS.

Unpaved roads that are maintained and managed by a public land management agency such as the United States Forest Service, Bureau of Land Management, Idaho Department of Lands, Idaho Department of Fish and Game, and the Idaho Department of Parks and Recreation have the following requirements:

- Valid Driver's License, if you are operating a motorcycle, you must have a motorcycle endorsement. IC 49-301 and IC 49-304.
- Valid Motorbike/ATV Registration and Sticker or valid License Plate and Registration. IC 49-426.

- Valid Liability Insurance. IC 49-1229.

- Carry Proof of Liability Insurance in vehicle. IC 49-1332.
- Helmet under age eighteen (motorcycle only). IC 49-666.
- Muffler and spark arrestor. Your muffler has to pass 96 db at the half-meter test. IC 67-7125.
- Headlight after dark/poor visibility. IC 49-903-and 49-905 (2)
- Taillight after dark/poor visibility. IC 49-903 and 49-906 (2)

ATV'S ON SNOWMOBILE TRAILS

According to the 67-7112 Idaho Code, any ATV operating on a groomed snowmobile trail, must purchase a snowmobile registration. Counties have the option to allow ATV's on groomed snowmobile trails.

FIRE SEASON (MAY 10TH THROUGH OCTOBER 20TH)

During the fire season in forested areas, all motorcycles and ATV's have to have Forest Service approved spark arrestor, shovel and bucket. A helmet can take the place of a bucket. IDAPA 20.04.01.
